In addition to supporting our educators during National Education Week, we also present school medals at six elementary schools for Scholastic Achievement.



This past year, we discovered that our schools really did not need school supplies; the schools received so many school supplies from other sources, they asked us to consider other needs.

 One school needed computer headsets for their second-grade class. We happily provided 100 headsets at a cost of \$100. The picture at right are the second-grade teachers who received the headsets at Aloma Elementary.



Another school asked if we could support their school pantry as they have 75-90 families who are homeless. Unlike other schools who send food home just for their impoverished student(s,) this school sends food home every weekend for the entire family. To support this effort, our unit members shopped for the food pantry, spending \$500 in early September. We even had help from the School Resource Officer and the Principal at Eastbrook Elementary as we delivered the items for their pantry.



While our activities do not necessarily "fit" in the areas noted on the Year End report form, we are impacting probably 150+/- students through our education programs, some of which are veteran children.

Starting this month, we will run a Service Officer "note" of interest for our bulletin. Many of us Veterans are entitled to benefits, but perhaps have not filed a claim not knowing how, what is needed, what forms to fill out, etc. and that is why I am here at the Post to assist with this. I go through an annual two-day training session to ensure I know the latest and greatest from the VA. The VA has established one new form called a 10-10EZ form that can be done on-line or mailed in and I can assist with this. I also have access to Florida Veterans Benefits, phone numbers for further assistance; however, I do NOT have access to a Veterans medical records, military records or VA records but can assist with direction to obtain any necessary information needed.

Also, as the Post Service Officer I have assisted two Veterans with financial assistance through district (the Post does not provide monetary assistance). Project VETRELIEF provides support for active duty, Veterans and families in Florida for a one-time offset fund to help with shelter, food, medical expenses or transportation. Funding is awarded on a case-by-case basis and the Veteran must have an Honorable Discharge, but not required to be an American Legion Member. The FRA enjoys the prestige of being the strongest, oldest and largest professional military association representing the Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard personnel. Branch 117 was charted in July 1948 here in the Orlando, Florida area and is incorporated with the State of Florida. The Branch is governed and organized with membership approved by-laws and standing rules. Branch elected officers are the President, Vice President, Secretary and the Treasurer. The Board of Directors is a group of shipmates appointed by the President.
