- 6.C&Y: We supply non-perishable food items for Thanksgiving

Dinner for a food pantry for a local elementary school.

Unit 112 Year End Education Report

Our Unit usually supports Education in several ways:

• In May each year, we present Scholastic Achievement Awards to one 5th grade young lady and one 5th grade young man at each of eight different elementary schools. Our May, 2023 presentations were well received at all the schools. We have already begun contacting the elementary schools to get the names of their recipients for the 2024 Scholastic Achievement Awards and we are





looking forward to presenting medals and certificates at the end of the year ceremonies in May 2024. For this project we spent approximately \$550 on medals, certificates, and presentation folders.

 Several years ago, in lieu of school supplies, we adopted the food pantry at one elementary school and just before Thanksgiving, we provided the nonperishable Thanksgiving dinner items (candied yams, marshmallows, stuffing, gravy, canned corn, canned green beans, cranberry sauce, and mashed potatoes) for the families in need of extra help.





These are the families identified by the school to receive a backpack full of food each Friday afternoon to carry the family over the weekend; many of these families are active duty or veteran families but we have no way of knowing how many of these families are military families. This year we spent about \$600 and had about 20 service hours dedicated to shopping for the food items, delivering and unloading the food in the food pantry. While this project could fall under Children and Youth or Community Service, we know that hungry children do not perform well in school, hence, our inclusion of this project under Education.

For Give Ten to Education this year and for several previous years
we have adopted one classroom and participated in the Scholastic
Books Classroom Book project. For \$10 per student, Scholastic
Books will provide one book per month for each student in the
classroom. We donated \$250 to provide each of 25 students with
a book every month this school year (Aug. - May.)



- One of our members is also very active teaching various classes, including ESOL classes, in the community and spent more than 600 hours preparing for her classes and teaching those classes.
- One of our members is also a school volunteer who helps in her son's classroom as well as helping in the clinic with student hearing screenings.
- Another of our members donates \$40 per month (\$480 annually) through Catholic Charities to support the education of a young girl in Kenya and another member has donated to the fund-raising efforts of the students at the school at which she teaches.
- One of our members is a teacher in New Jersey and she contributes to various scholarship funds to support her local students. This year, she contributed \$150 towards these scholarships.
- Another member donated \$85 to "A Gift for teaching" as well as donating art supplies worth \$50 to one of her local schools' art classes.

In total for the 2023-2024 program year, our unit and its members have contributed \$2165 and more than 775 volunteer hours in our Education projects.
