We are a small unit with seven active members currently, the following are a few highlights from our year.

1. Education-We adopted a classroom as part of the "Give Ten To Education" program. We donated \$250 for this program, 25 students participate in this program where they read a book a month. We present Scholastic Achievement certificate and medal to one 5th grade boy and girl in 8 different elementary schools.

2. C&Y-Support the Eastbrook Elementary school back pack project. Three members spent more than 15 hours shopping for the food and delivery to the school. This project provided non-perishable food items for about 15 families for Thanksgiving.

3. Americanism-We promoted the Essay contest in 8 elementary and 5 high schools but received response from 3 elementary schools for a total of 10 essays. We chose the winners and sent it forward to Department. We will present the winners a certificate and medal during school awards programs in May.

4. VA&R-Two members helped Post members shop for the VA Giving Tree family program at Christmas time. One member provides bookkeeping, banking and Quick Book for the Post and SAL Legion family. Another member is a practicing psychologist and donates time pro-bono counseling services to veterans.

5. Community Service-Two members work over 800 hours helping their HOA in various manners from writing the HOA newsletter, banking and planning events. Two members help in their churches from helping in the food pantry to ushering the services. Two other members run races for charity plus taking part in the Polar Bear Plunge for Special Olympics. These are just the highlights of Community Service in total our members

worked over 1085 hours and \$4150 in donations. We are only 7 members.

6.Girls State -We interviewed 8 girls from various local high schools.We selected 2 Delegates and 2 Alternates(1 delegate and 1 alternate is over-quota). The remaining 4 girls were selected as alternates for other units.

7.Poppy- We did not have a Poppy booth but did give out Poppies at a Veterans Day event at a local school(no donations collected)

8.National Security- We participated in Legion Family event such as Memorial Day,9-11,Four Chaplains. One member attend the National Security zoom meeting.

Winter Park Memorial Unit 112 has several members who participate in organizations supporting youth in addition to their participation with the Auxiliary.

- One of our members serves on the President's Cabinet for the Central Florida Council Scouting America Board of Directors as the Council's Youth protection Advocate in addition to serving at the district level in Seminole County as a District Committee member and an Assistant District Commissioner. This member makes her paid Zoom account available for the District Scouting meetings in Seminole County. This member has spent more than 100 hours in service to youth through the Scouting America program.
- One of our members has attended several ALA Academy Live Virtual seminars and well as all the Department of Florida Children and Youth Committee Zoom meetings held this year.

This year, our Unit embraced the Young Hero and Good Deed awards. We work with eight elementary schools and have asked each school to suggest their students for the Good Deed or Young Hero awards. We are also working with the two Scouting America troops sponsored by our American Legion Post so we can recognize their Eagle Scouts as they complete their projects. While we did not have any names submitted by our schools, we do have several scouts who are nearing the completion of their Eagle projects so we should have some Good Deed awards later this school year or in the fall.

In total, our members have donated more than 200 hours assisting various Children and Youth programs both in and outside of the Legion family.

For our major Children and Youth activity, we support the Eastbrook Elementary School Food Pantry backpack project. We spent about \$200 and three of our members spent an additional 15 hours shopping for food and delivering food to the school. This project provides all the non-perishable food items that about 15 families need for a nice Thanksgiving dinner.

Unit 112 Year End Education Report

Our Unit usually supports Education in several ways:

- In May each year, we present Scholastic Achievement Awards to one 5th grade young lady and one 5th grade young man at each of eight different elementary schools. Our May,



2024 presentations were well received at all the schools. We have already begun contacting elementary schools to get the names of their recipients for the 2025 Scholastic Achievement Awards and we are looking forward to presenting medals and certificates at the end of the year ceremonies in May 2025. For this project we spent



approximately \$550 on medals, certificates, and presentation folders.

- About five years ago, in lieu of school supplies, we adopted the food pantry at one elementary school and just before Thanksgiving, we provided the non-perishable Thanksgiving dinner items (candied yams, marshmallows, stuffing, gravy, canned corn, canned green beans, cranberry sauce, and mashed potatoes)



for families in need of extra help. These are the families identified by the school to receive a



backpack full of food each Friday afternoon to carry the family over the weekend; many of these families are active duty or veteran families but we have no way of knowing how many of these families are military families. This year we spent about \$600 and had about 20 service hours dedicated to shopping for the food items, delivering and unloading the

food in the food pantry. While this project could fall under Children and Youth or Community Service, we know that hungry children do not perform well in school, hence, our inclusion of this project under Education.

- For Give Ten to Education this year and for several previous years we have adopted one classroom and participated in the Scholastic Books Classroom Book project. For \$10 per student, Scholastic Books will provide one book per month for each student in the classroom. We donated \$250 to provide each of 25 students with a book every month this school year (Aug. - May.)



- One of our members is also very active teaching various classes, including ESOL classes, in the community and spent more than 100+ hours preparing for her classes and teaching those classes.
- One of our members is also a school volunteer who helps in her granddaughter's classroom as a party helper.
- Another of our members donates \$40 per month (\$480 annually) through Catholic Charities to support the education of a young girl in Kenya and another member has donated to the fund-raising efforts of the students at the school at which she teaches.

In total for the 2024-2025 program year, our unit and its members have contributed \$2030.00 and more than 200 volunteer hours in our Education projects.
